The Easter Acclamation and Paschal Candle Lighting

P - Let us pray. Eternal God, in Jesus Christ you have given the light of life to all the world. Bless this new fire, and increase in us a desire to shine forth with the brightness of Christ's rising, until we feast at the banquet of eternal light; through the Sun of righteousness, Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

First Reading – Acts 10:34-43

A reading from the tenth chapter Acts "Peter fairly exploded with his good news: "It's God's own truth, nothing could be plainer: God plays no favorites! It makes no difference who you are or where you're from-if you want God and are ready to do as he says, the door is open. The Message he sent to the children of Israel-that through Jesus Christ everything is being put together again-well, he's doing it everywhere, among everyone. "You know the story of what happened in Judea. It began in Galilee after John preached a total life-change. Then Jesus arrived from Nazareth, anointed by God with the Holy Spirit, ready for action. He went through the country helping people and healing everyone who was beaten down by the Devil. He was able to do all this because God was with him. "And we saw it, saw it all, everything he did in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem where they killed him, hung him from a cross. But in three days God had him up, alive, and out where he could be seen. Not everyone saw him-he wasn't put on public display. Witnesses had been carefully hand-picked by God beforehand-us! We were the ones, there to eat and drink with him after he came back from the dead. He commissioned us to announce this in public, to bear solemn witness that he is in fact the One whom God destined as Judge of the living and dead. But we're not alone in this. Our witness that he is the means to forgiveness of sins is backed up by the witness of all the prophets."" (Acts 10:34–43, The Message)

A reading from the third chapter of Colossians. Since you have been raised to new life with Christ, set your sights on the realities of heaven, where Christ sits in the place of honor at God's right hand. Gospel Matthew 28:1-10

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the twenty-eighth chapter. *Glory to You, O Lord.* "After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." So they

left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. HOW TO SERVE

- For those who are by themselves, take a piece of bread and say the "the body of Christ, broken for me." Then take the cup and "the blood of Christ shed for me."
- If there are two or more of you, You can commune the person to your right (or left) and go around the table that way.
- The person distributing the bread says, "Body of Christ, given for you." The person distributing the wine/grape juice should say, "Blood of Christ, shed for you." The recipient can respond with "Amen." Some choose to cross themselves.

Finish all the bread and wine – either as we commune together, or as part of your Easter meal.

Blessing after Communion

P - May the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you and keep you in His peace. *Amen.*

Prayer after Communion

A - Holy Lord, at Your table we have tasted forgiveness and drunk Your love. Send us now into our homes and neighborhoods to be the pardon of God to the lost and the blessing of Christ to our neighbor, through Jesus, our Lord. *Amen.*
